Kia ora Salford Whānau,

We started swimming today. This is an important part of our school curriculum as we work to develop the water confidence and safety skills of the children in their 10 sessions, especially with water being a feature of all of New Zealand's landscapes. Invercargill is very fortunate to have these swimming sessions paid for by the ILT.

The children will need:

- togs and towels dry for swimming each day
- their usual school shoes (crocs, jandals, bare feet are not appropriate for going to and from swimming or for a usual school day)
- uniform (all clothing) and swimming items named (it is helpful if children know where to look for their name)
- to be at school on time (especially those who are swimming first and need to be on the buses by 9:15am)

We enjoy seeing the growth of the children during their swimming sessions and look forward to the pride and achievement that will no doubt come from this year's learning.

A reminder that children are not to be at school **before 8:30am** (Road Patrollers can be a few minutes earlier so they are on duty at 8:30 promptly). Children are not monitored prior to 8:30 when teachers are in classrooms to meet them, chat and check in for the morning.

At the end of the day staff support children at the Drop Off Zone until **3:15pm**. All children should be collected from school by this time or have arrangements to walk home or attend After School Care.
