Salford School Reroofing.

We look forward to seeing you all supporting the children with this event. (Top placings in each age group event will earn a place to compete at the Phoenix Zone Cross Country. Top placings are determined by ease of completing the event, running all the way, distance between placings etc. A maximum of 10 students from each event.) The Phoenix Zone Cross Country is being held in Bluff on 22nd May/Haratua with postponement being 26th May / Haratua.

The **Southland Primary School Cross Country** event for **10 and 11 Year old qualifiers** from each zone is scheduled for **Friday/ Rāmere 13th June / Pipiri**. (The top 6 runners from the 10 and 11 year old events earn a place in the Phoenix Zone team to compete at the Southlands).

Chess Tournament:

A reminder that all entries for the upcoming Chess Power Junior Chess Tournament are to be completed by tomorrow (**Tuesday**/ **Rāatu 6th May**/ **Haratua**) so that the children can be registered for the event. The Chess Tournament takes place next **Tuesday**/ **Rāatu 13th May**/ **Haratua** in the school hall. All links and information are on Hero – simply put Chess Tournament into the search option and it will come to the top of the posting list for you. This Tournament is for tamariki in Year 4, 5 and 6 only please.

Attendance:

Daily attendance is collected and collated by the Ministry of Education for all New Zealand schools. Each term we receive a summary report and break down about the attendance for the school.

For term one 2025 we had **85%** of our tamariki with regular attendance (Attendance of 90% or greater). This equates to 215 ākonga with less than 5 days absence across the term. 11% of our tamariki attended school between 80% and 90%. This is between 5 and 9 days absent.

Further information regarding attendance will be shared over the next couple of newsletters to keep you informed of processes as expected by the Ministry of Education.


Mid Year Learning Conferences:

Invitation to Board of Trustees Meeting

The Salford School Board of Trustees invites all parents, caregivers, and community members to a Community Consultation Meeting to discuss a proposed change to our school board election cycle.

Date: Tuesday, 13 May

We value your input and encourage you to attend and share your thoughts on the proposed shift from triennial board elections to a staggered 18-month cycle. This is an important opportunity to be involved in decisions that affect the future governance of our school.

Proposal of Moving from Triennial to Staggered 18-Month School Board Elections

Background:

Currently, Salford School Board of Trustees members are elected every three years (triennially), with all elected positions contested at once. A proposed shift would introduce staggered elections every 18 months, with a portion of board seats up for election each cycle.

Pros

1. Continuity and Stability

- Prevents full turnover of the board at once, preserving institutional memory and long-term strategy.
- Facilitates smoother transitions, as experienced members remain during onboarding of new members.

2. Improved Governance

- Reduces risk of politicised board swings, encouraging more consistent policy-making and budgeting.
- Encourages more deliberate decision-making due to ongoing electoral accountability.

3. Increased Community Engagement

- More frequent elections keep education issues on the public agenda.
- Voters have more regular opportunities to influence school governance.

4. Better Candidate Recruitment

 Smaller number of seats up for election may encourage more individuals to run, especially those reluctant to participate in larger, high-pressure contests.

Cons

1. Higher Administrative Costs

More frequent elections incur increased expenses for organizing, staffing, and promoting each cycle.

2. Voter Fatigue and Lower Turnout

• Frequent elections may reduce public interest and turnout, weakening democratic representation.

3. Short-Term Focus Risks

• With elections every 18 months, board members might focus more on immediate results than long-term planning.

4. Complexity and Confusion

 Voters may find the staggered system harder to understand, especially regarding which seats are up and when.

Conclusion:

Shifting to staggered 18-month elections can enhance stability and accountability but requires balancing administrative burden and voter engagement. Community education and efficient planning would be key to a successful transition.

Communicating with Whānau:

We have a range of communication methods for keeping you up to date with what is happening at Salford School.

<u>Hero -</u> All formal communication will come through Hero -newsletters, notices and reporting etc. You have access to your child's attendance, reporting graphs, and formal curriculum learning information posts. These all accumulate overtime so as your child progresses through Salford School their progress in their learning can be seen over time.

<u>Skool Loop -</u> Sports notices will be shared through Skool Loop. Enrolments for sports can be completed directly on this app. You can also communicate your child's absence to school through Skool Loop as well.

<u>Facebook -</u> This is our sunshine, rainbows and lollipops page! We will be sharing lots of great things that happen at the school, events and opportunities as well as photos of just the 'everyday' things as well.

<u>School Website-</u> This is where you can find all information about the school (We have a new website up and running but some areas are still under construction)

<u>SeeSaw -</u> Some kaiako may use this as a method of communication and sharing with you. The teachers using it will provide information regarding this app and how to access it etc.
