Kia ora Salford Whānau,

We are looking forward to our Hautapu Ceremony this Rāpare (Thursday) morning, welcoming the rising of Matariki together.

The ceremony will begin at **8:00am** at the long jump pit. This area will be cordoned off for safety. Children cannot attend without an adult supervising them please as this ceremony is before school, in the darkness and is not compulsory, so attendance rolls will not be taken.

During the ceremony there is a part where we honour those who have passed since the last Matariki, you are invited to put the names of your loved ones into the fire so that they can be sent to the stars. Please bring these pieces of paper with names on them with you.

We have 35 tamariki who will lead us through the Hautapu ceremony then a karakia kai will be shared with everyone before heading to the hall for a sausage sizzle breakfast afterwards. We do have a limited supply of cornflakes, weetbix and tinned fruit for those who may have missed the sausage sizzle order cut off.


Milo will also be available, we ask that you bring your own mug for this please.



NOTE—Salford School will be **POSTAL VOTING** for the upcoming elections—Election day is the **10th of September 2025**.

The Main Roll is open for inspection now and will close on the **16th July 2025**. After the main roll is closed a Supplementary roll will open. If you have been left off the main roll there is still time for you to register—Supplementary roll closes **4th August 2025**.

Eligibility to participate in a parent election:

Education and Training Act 2020 Section 10 defines the term "parent" as meaning someone who is the person's father, mother, legal guardian, or immediate caregiver. Both parents of a student have the right to vote, even if they do not live with the student.

Definition of the "Immediate Caregiver"

An immediate caregiver is defined in S1 Education and Training Act 2020 as:

- A relation to a student who usually lives in a household that includes the student's father or mother, but not both, but also includes the spouse or partner of the father or mother, means the spouse or partner
- In relation to a student who usually lives in a household that includes the student's father or mother and no spouse or partner of the father or mother, but also includes a person who has turned 20 and has a day-to-day responsibility for the student clearly greater than that of any other person, means that person
- In relation to a student who usually lives in a household that does not include the student's father or the student's mother, means any member of that household who has turned 20 and has a day-to-day responsibility for the student clearly greater than that of any other person.

Time to enrol now for 2026, this includes all families with children turning 5.

IN ZONE Enrolments

Parents of children living "in zone" for Salford school are reminded to enrol your child for 2026. Especially where children are starting in terms 1 or 2 but also for the full year too.

If your child is turning 5 in terms 3 and 4 this year, we should already have their enrolment form, and if not, <u>please action this now.</u>

Note for Parents of students on an <u>"Out of Zone Enrolment"</u>, with younger siblings turning 5 in 2026.

Spaces for Out of Zone enrolments are very tight, so if you have a child turning 5 in 2026, no matter when this is. Please request an electronic enrolment pack to enrol your child NOW.

We have had a number of late enrolments for siblings of current students in 2025, who are residing out of our school zone, and this alters the balance when a ballot needs to be held. Help us to help you.

There is a need to remind Parents, this type of enrolment is <u>NOT</u> an automatic enrolment, so please enrol your children early before the school opens enrolment up to new, "Out of Zone" inquiries.


