Kia ora Salford Whānau,

With only half of the term left to go there is still a fair bit to pack into the term and the year yet.

We have had some fabulous skills and talents shared with us this year for Salford Got Talent with more yet to come! Roller skating, magic, gymnastics, dance, singing and musical instruments all in the mix. Ka pai to all of the tamariki showing resilience and being brave to share their talents with the audiences each day.

Teacher Only Day:

A reminder that school is closed next Rāmere 21st Whiringa A Rangi (Friday 21st November) for a curriculum focused development day.

We will be exploring the Government's 2024 Curriculum further, looking at best practice at Salford School in alignment with the scope and sequence from the Mathematics with Statistics and Literacy Curriculums. School will be closed for the day while the staff work through these and prepare for teaching and learning in 2026 using these curriculum more fully.

Drop off Zone:



The Drop Off Zone is a very dangerous place for our tamariki at the moment and we may need to close it if this remains the case. Having traffic backed up at least four cars long in both directions waiting to get into the drop off puts everyone at risk.

On Rāmere (Friday) the traffic was gridlocked as a car wanting to turn right out of a packed drop off zone could not move - there were four cars lined up waiting to turn right into the drop off, another one wanting to drive straight through and then another 4 lined up wanting to turn left into the drop off.

The tamariki and kaiako on road patrol cannot see down the street, the tamariki using the footpath have no clear passage and cars moving quickly when a gap appears do not see the tamariki crossing the drive ways either, not to mention the tamariki walking on the curved path around the drop off as cars pull in quickly and drive up onto the curbing.

Then add in the cars that make a second lane of traffic in the drop off area and get angry when staff will not let their children get into the vehicles in the middle of the drop off.

This behaviour is unsafe and unnecessary. It puts the tamariki in danger.

Using the drop off:

- 1. Pull in from the west side of Lamond Street turning left
- 2. Exit the drop off turning right to head east down Lamond Street
- 3. Move as far forward around the drop off area as you can
- 4. If you cannot see your child waiting, drive on and come back Your child must be able to get into or out of the vehicle themselves without assistance and on the passenger side of the vehicle. If they cannot do this; drive on, park and walk back to collect your child

In order to keep the tamariki safe we will close the drop off if a vast improvement is not noticed.
