# Newsletter

Kia ora Salford Whānau,

Welcome to the final week of term three 2024. A fantastic term filled with opportunities for tamariki to get involved in learning beyond the classroom through a wide variety of activities. It has been fabulous to see the number of children getting involved in these opportunities, taking responsibility for practising (in school and beyond) growing and the results of all of their mahi being supported and celebrated widely.

Dedication and time above and beyond teaching hours has been provided by teaching staff to ensure the ākonga are prepared, confident and excited to do their very best. These opportunities and experiences simply would not be available for the children without the staff to support, coach, organise, manage, and at times step out of their comfort zone in very public arenas. Sincere thanks to the team of staff who support the tamariki with all of these additional experiences and opportunities.

#### **Mental Health Awareness Week:**

This week is also Mental Health Awareness Week. With the focus on learning about Mental Health through the MITEY Programme at Salford School and initiatives such as Chatbus we are working hard to develop positive mental health and well-being for our tamariki. This does not mean being happy all the time. It means being able to identify why we feel different ways, how we manage these feelings and respond in appropriate ways rather than lashing out or bottling up (neither of these are positive in dealing with emotion or situations that challenge us). Identifying positive emotions is also a focus through these means. It has been fabulous to see the tamariki develop their emotional awareness to extend beyond happy, sad and angry throughout the year. Discussions are also showing tamariki developing greater understanding of how others may feel and why in a range of situations as well.
