Nau mai, haere mai and welcome back to school for term three. We are excited to have Mrs Russell return to school from maternity leave to open Room 14 with our new entrant tamariki. We welcome **Mrs Iveson** to the team for term three and four as well. Mrs Iveson is working in Room 14, job sharing with **Mrs Russell**.

We also have **Cassidy** working in the school on Mondays and Tuesdays as part of her KaiĀwhina Kaiako training. We are looking forward to supporting her with her training over the term.

Welcome to **Lewis**, **Zack**, **Maddy**, **Clovis**, **Fatma**, **Dakota** and their whānau who have joined us at Salford School since the last newsletter. We are pleased to have you here at Salford School and look forward to getting to know you all over your time here.

We had a great start to the term with **Kennedy School of Music** visiting and sharing their skills with us, then **The Playhouse Theatre Group** came and performed *'The Reluctant Dragon'* which was about a dragon who did not want to live up to the stereotype of mean, fire breathing, knight fighting dragons. The performance was followed up with all sorts of fabulous dragon learning in class throughout the day. We love having The Playhouse Theatre Group at school for their performances and have already booked them for next year.

John Parson's spent two days working in the classrooms talking to the tamariki about being confident and safe online citizens. We were fortunate to be able to offer two whānau sessions as well. Thank you to the 30+ whānau members who took advantage of these sessions to upskill and find out about trends and patterns in negative online behaviour putting children at risk. While many of us see screen time as a challenge for our children, John focused more on the time that screens are being used (evenings with the amount of time children's brains need to produce melatonin after being exposed to screens) and the impact this has on sleep, mobility and diet, and the impact all of this has on learning and social relationships.

John has sent through a number of video links and resources. Some of these were shared through Hero on Friday. Every few days more will be shared with you all to support you in guiding your tamariki safely through developing their online skills, maintaining your home values online and offline and developing their confidence in being safe online.



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We have copies of John's first book 'Keeping Our Children Safe Online' in the office if you would like to borrow one to read.

On Friday we had a group of tamariki working with Stu Brown from Active Southland teaching some Taonga Tākaro (Māori Games). The children will be able to teach these games to other children at school and share their learning throughout the school.

Monday 26th August - All enrolments are due in to the school of your choice. We cannot emphasise how important it is to have your enrolments in by this day, regardless of whether you are in zone or out of zone for the school. Even if you are in zone and do not enrol by this date, you may miss out on a place.

The high schools work out "out of zone place numbers" based on their enrolments they receive on the close off date. If you wait or put your enrolment forms in late you may find you miss out.

Friday 30th August - Acceptances are sent out to parents and caregivers. These may be emailed or posted.

Friday 15th November - New Entrant Day. The Year 6 children will spend the morning at their High School for 2025. Detailed information will come about this day later on in the year.

Staff Parking:

The parking area behind Rooms 5 - 8 is for staff parking only. We ask that parents do not park in these spaces at any time.

We have specialists, Room 12 staff, Ministry of Education, Professional learning providers and of course daily staff who need these parks to be available.

IN ZONE Enrolments



Parents of children living "in zone" for Salford school are reminded to enrol your child for 2025. Especially where children are starting in terms 1 or 2. Your early enrolment helps us with the orginisation of classes for the 2025 school year. If your child turns 5 in terms 3 and 4, it is also helpful to know how many additional children to expect for the year.

Note for Parents of students on an <u>"Out of Zone Enrolment"</u>, with siblings turning 5 in 2025.

Spaces for Out of Zone enrolments are very tight, so if you have a child turning 5 in 2025, not matter when this is. Please request an electronic enrolment pack to enrol your child **now**. We have had a number of late enrolments for siblings of children in 2024, who are residing out of our school zone and this alters the balance when a ballot needs to be held

There is a need to remind Parents, this type of enrolment is <u>not</u> an automatic enrolment, so please enrol your children early before the school opens enrolment up to new "Out of Zone" inquiries.

Home Zone Description:

North Waihopai River from Queens Drive to Racecourse Road

West Queens Drive, from Layard Street to Waihopai River

West side from 444 Queens Drive

East side from James Hargest Junior College

South North side of Layard Street from Queens Drive to

Racecourse Road

NOTE: Properties on the South Side of Layard Street, are not included in the Salford School Home zone.
