Teacher Only Day / New Curriculum

Thank you for your support with our recent teacher only day.

The staff spent the day going through the new Maths and English Curriculums that are being introduced. While we do not need to change a lot of what we are doing, the expectations for achievement are being lifted with the new documents. This means we will be reviewing what we teach and when throughout our programmes. We will also be working through the potential gaps in our current programme and the new expectations to ensure everything is being met and given the time it deserves. This all takes time of course. Alongside the new curriculum, the government is placing greater emphasis on attendance. With the lifted expectations of achievement, excellent school attendance is imperative.

Children will need their togs, a towel and goggles (if they wear them when swimming) every day for their swimming sessions. Please make sure everything is named clearly for easy returning. Togs and towels need to be dried every night ready for the next day as staff will be busy teaching swimming and support with getting dried and dressed will be minimal.

Please help your child prepare for swimming over the next couple of weeks by supporting them to be able to dry and dress themselves into their uniform independently. Being able to manage their clothing and packing their swimming bag is also helpful so that clothes do not get lost, muddled with anyone else's or wet from being dropped on the floor. (all very common occurrences during school swimming) It is also important for children to know what their towel, togs and goggles look like - often we are trying to find owners and the child does not actually know what their bits and pieces look like. Naming uniform is also helpful. Having 286 uniforms at the pool in the space of a couple of hours can cause a wee bit of confusion. Identifiable uniform (the children knowing where their uniform is named is also helpful) is very helpful when trying to locate owners - even undies, singlets and socks.
