- The family that donates the most calves wins a special prize.


Calves will be sold through the Temuka sale yards in late November.

Scabies

Public Health Information Sheet



Scabies is a skin condition caused by a parasitic mite (a living thing). Scabies usually produces a very itchy rash.

Scabies mites

The scabies mite is so small that it cannot be seen by the naked eye. The female mite burrows under the skin and lives there. It lays eggs and leaves behind poos and chemicals that irritate the skin. The skin becomes inflamed

The scabies mite lives on human skin, and does not live on cats, dogs or other animals. It can survive for up to 4 days on other surfaces like bedding or clothing. Most of the time mites will die if they have been off human skin for over 2 days. But if it is cold they might last up to 4

Symptoms of scabies

An itchy rash usually develops between a few days and 6 weeks after a person has caught scables. The itch mostly affects the arms, and trunk. It is usually worse at night or after a

This intense itch can continue after you have been treated but this does not mean the treatment has not worked. The itch may take up to 6 or 8 weeks to stop as your body is still reacting to the mites.

The rash commonly appears between the fingers and toes, around the wrists, in the groin, around the nipples and under the armpits. It does not usually affect the face and scalp unless the person is a young child or infant.

Scratching can lead to serious skin conditions such as impetigo (school sores) and other skin infections. These complications often require treatment with antibiotics and should be seen

Keeping fingernails short and clean, good hand hygiene, and avoiding scratching can prevent skin infections developing.

You can be infected with scapies without having

Diagnosing scabies

symptoms can vary widely between people. It can be confused with:

Your healthcare provider usually diagnoses scables after examining your skin. Sometimes they might arrange for a skin scraping to be

How to treat scabies

It is best to treat scabies just before going to bed. Scabies will not go away without treatment. It is important to treat all areas of your body, even if some parts are not itchy! Enough cream/lotion should be provided to cover your entire body with a reasonable layer.

How and when to apply the cream



Before Bed

- 1. Cover the whole body with cream/lotion (Permethrin) before bed.
- צ Start at your scalp, face, chin and ears.
- Y Continue down your neck and cover all areas, including private parts and backside, until you get to the soles of your feet.
- Make sure you apply cream between fingers, toes and under nails.
- Apply enough cream to cover your entire body. Younger individuals may only require half a tube to complete coverage, whilst rangatahi and adults may require one or two tubes.
- ע Women also need to apply permethrin under the breasts and around the nipples, as the scabies mite can burrow into these areas as well.
- 2. If you wash your hands following application of the cream, it is important to put the cream/lotion back on your hands before bed.
- 3. Sleep in normal attire, as long as these clothes are washed the next day as per next step.



The next morning

- After sleeping in the cream, have a bath or shower the next morning and wear clean
- ע Wash bedding, the clothing you wore while sleeping and replace your bed with clean sheets.



Bedding and Towels

- צ Sheets, pillowcases, towels and facecloths should be washed in hot water.
- It is not necessary to wash blankets. duvets or quilts. You can hang them out in the sun for a day. You can also take the mattress outside to air in direct sunlight.
- Make sure your bed is fitted with clean sheets etc prior to applying your lotion.
- Permethrin lotion or cream is safe in hapū mama, breastfeeding and younger children under New Zealand medical quidelines

ע If you are breastfeeding, wash the permethrin from your nipples before you breastfeed, and then re-apply afterwards.
