#### Dear Parents, Waitaki Hui Ako

On Thursday we had our Kapa Haka group perform in Oamaru as part of the Waitaki Hui Ako. The children made us proud. They only had a small amount of time to practise, since the start of this term but they gave it their all. A big thanks to Adahlia and Adaia's Grandmother Remona and Mrs McLellan for all the time given to the group.









#### Olympic Dress Up and Activity Day:

Today we are holding our olympic Day dress up and activity day. What amazing costumes we have seen this morning. Starting at 11:30 we will have the children competing in a variety of activities from obstacle course, hobby horse, tug or war, laundry basketball, synchronised swimming on land, relays, hockey and rhythmic gymnastics. The children are having a wonderful day to celebrate the end of the Paris Olympic Games this weekend.













#### <u>Maths Chanaes</u>

Over the weekend the government announced some pretty drastic changes to the teaching of maths, with a very short implementation timeframe for the beginning of 2025. This is unprecedented. The data shared was grim but is questionable, so I just want to clarify this for you all.

The data quoted was taken in 2022 from a group of only 853 Year 8 students from 42 schools. The assessment that was undertaken was measured against the soon to be introduced Maths Curriculum - a curriculum that wasn't even out or being taught at the time of the assessments, meaning that some students were being assessed against things that they hadn't even been taught

At Glenavy we are continually working to raise our achievement levels of Maths (and other learning areas), and with our implementation of Structured Literacy to support our akonga/learners with Reading, Spelling and Writing, we are also looking at a clear focus on raising the teaching of Mathematical knowledge as a way to increase student achievement in this area. HOWEVER - we all know that not all children learn in the same way. This move seems like a one size fits all approach to teaching and to learning. This would be like the government telling doctors they must x-ray all patients in the same way and then treat them all in the same way. Just as each doctor's assessment of what a patient requires is individualised, so too does a teacher with a child's assessment information and teaching programme. We are very concerned about this roll out and I certainly hope we will still be able to tailor a maths programme that works best for each and every child, rather than expecting all children to do things the same way.



We already know who our children who struggle with Maths are, and further resources (such as additional teacher time) should be the priority and this is what needs to be considered, in order to support these children and increase achievement. Giving everyone a workbook isn't going to enact the changes required long term.

At this stage we have no idea of what will be expected of us in order to prepare for this new way of teaching maths from the beginning of 2025, however I expect that it may require teacher only days in Term 4, when the process has been worked out. When we know more about what is happening we will let you know. I expect that we will also share information about what the implementation of this programme will look like in your child's classroom from 2025

#### Bus Ski Trip:

Our second ski trip is booked for Friday 6th September. It is a big day, as we leave the school at 6:15am in the morning. Please be at school by 6am. This bus trip is full so if you have not brought back your form, you will be on the waitlist. We have plenty of ski clothes for your children to borrow. Come and see Rebecca in the office and she will sort you out. Please contact Rebecca if you can not make the ski trip now as places on the bus are very, very tight. We will be confirming attendance in the next few weeks



#### **School Production**

This year we have changed it up and because our school has grown we will be performing at the Regent Theatre in Waimate. We will be selling tickets to ensure we have enough space at a cost of \$2 per person. Tickets will go on sale from the school office from week 5. Glenavy Green Sticks played Pembroke Panthers and won 5-1.




