Dear Parents.

Welcome back to 2024. I hope you have had a great holiday and were able to spend time with your families. I saw a lot of relieved parents on Wednesday as they handed their children back over to the school. It is so exciting to have all the children back this year, some seem to have grown over the holiday. I am looking forward to working with our student leaders this year as we grow the roles and responsibilities.

I am going to go over a few important notes for the start of the year below:

New Staff:

I would like to welcome <u>Mr Ryan Dowling</u> to our school. Ryan comes with a lot of experience in athletics, swimming, physical education and classroom teaching. He will be working in Mr Ross's class one day a week, Miss MacLeod's class one day a week and Miss Coker's class one day a week. The other 2 days will be releasing teachers for their planning and assessment time.



I would also like to welcome into the classroom teaching role <u>Mrs</u>

<u>Twane Dirker (Mrs T)</u>. Twane has been working at Glenavy School

for the past year as a reliever teacher, she has been working with small groups of English Second Language children and also supporting the class teachers. Twane has come from South Africa with 20 years experience as a classroom teacher. Twane is a NZ registered Teacher and I feel so privileged to have Twane at school as she is an excellent teacher.

Tent City:

These notices went out yesterday, please rip off the back page and return to the school ASAP. This is an opportunity for the whole

school community to come together and share food and meet one another. This is a highlight for the children and staff. If your child does not want to stay the night at school this is ok, but please come for the afternoon, dinner and games and then take your child home. All children who are in Kororā class need to have a parent with



them. We need lots of parents staying the night as we are a growing school and need a certain number to be able to run this fun night. So please think about this.

School Uniforms:

We now have one of each size of polo shirt and sweatshirt at school to try on if you need to know what size to order. They are in the office. Come in at some stage and have a try on before you order online. Uniforms are now bought and ordered from NZ Uniforms. I have attached the link address to this newsletter. All children MUST be wearing the correct school uniform. Please do not let your children wear hooded sweatshirts from other places. I will be looking at uniforms over the next few days and asking children to make sure they come to school in the correct clothes. When your child goes to High School they will be very strict with uniforms and we endeavour to do the same in order that the children are proud of what they look like.



Swimming:

Swimming started on Wednesday with only a few children with their swimwear. Mr Dowling will be teaching swimming every Wednesday so all children need to have their togs at school every day. The teachers will be teaching swimming on the other days. NZ is surrounded by water and there is no excuse for children not to be able to swim. Lessons are given at the child's level, so they will be supported in the process. If we see children not bring their swimwear to school I will be ringing home to talk about this.



Free Dental Care for Children including special information regarding Year 8 students

One of our Community Dental Service vans will be making a visit to your school soon.

- Only the children who currently require a check-up will be seen at this visit.
 Please do not be concerned if your child is not called for a check-up this time.
- The dental therapist will provide a regular check-up and preventative care which may include:

Cleaning/Scaling (to remove plaque from teeth)

Dental x-rays (to check for decay in teeth, or presence and position of teeth)

Fluoride Varnish (painted on teeth to help prevent decay)

Fissure Sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required.

- If your child requires any other dental care, they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required.
- When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our Call Centre as soon as possible as you will
 need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this dental care.
- Please contact our Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to
 enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care (a dental
 therapist will call you back)
- Year 8 students: all year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred
 from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from year 9 until their 18th birthday.
 To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not
 orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for year 9 onwards.
 More information will be sent home after their year 8 check-up.
