Solar and Heat Pump Grant in Our Swimming Pool

At the end of last year the Glenavy Pool Trust was awarded a grant from Meridian Energy for \$50,000. This has enabled us to add a new heat pump to our swimming pool and attach solar panels to help keep the power bill down.


BNZ Kiwi Hoops Basketball in Schools

Uniforms are now bought and ordered from $\underline{NZ\ Uniforms}$. I have attached the link address to this newsletter.


















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
