I'd like to acknowledge our KPC for the important work that they do for our school and the Kahutara Hall. The KPC meets on the first Monday of each month, and they plan ways to help raise money to support our students. The fundraiser they organised this term was the 'Cookie Time Orders' and they successfully raised \$632. Thank you to everyone in our school community who supported this.

This term, the KPC has paid \$5000 to the school to pay for the following things:

- ★ Online Reading Eggs subscriptions for all of our Year 1 Year 4 students (worth \$33 each)
- ★ Online Mathseeds subscriptions for all of our Year 1 Year 4 students (worth \$33 each)
- ★ Online Mathletics subscriptions for all of our Year 5-Year 8 students(worth \$30 each)
- $\star$  An annual school subscription for the House of Science School Kits (\$800)

The online subscriptions for Maths and Reading are great support programmes for our students. They have a one year subscription to the programme, and they use this as part of their classroom work, and they can also login to their account and use this from home. If your child does not have their login details at home, you can contact their classroom teacher to ask for this. The House of Science Kits are an amazing resource! A different kit is delivered to our school every fortnight and is packed with hands-on experiments, science lessons, equipment and consumables.
