Kia ora koutou,

We've had a very busy two weeks with lots of great work going on in our classrooms, interschool swimming events, Hub 1 and Hub 2 visiting the Golden Shears, our mufti day fundraiser for Carterton Indoor Pool and Technology lessons at Featherston School starting for our students in Hub 1. I'm really pleased with how settled our classrooms are, and the work that our students are creating as part of our unit - Who am I? Ko wai ahau? I've particularly enjoyed looking at students' writing about the meaning of their name, and places that are important to their family.

Our teaching team has been using a range of assessments to get a snapshot of student achievement, and to be able to identify learning goals and next steps. Students have completed an easTTle writing assessment, 1-1 maths interviews with their teacher, online reading and maths assessments for Years 3 - 8, running records for Years 1 - 6 and a school-wide basic facts and spelling assessment. We've staggered the assessments across the term so we don't overwhelm students, and I will now begin analysing our school-wide data and identify areas we need to target and goals for acceleration.

We will be holding parent-teacher meetings in Weeks 8, 9 and 10, so you have an opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and find out how your child has started the year, their results from recent assessments and so we can answer any questions that you may have about the class programme or your child's progress to date. Information about the days, times and how to book these interviews will be shared via a separate newsletter at the beginning of next week.

Well done to all of our students who competed at the South Wairarapa Swimming event last week in Masterton. You gave it your best effort and we can be very proud of the number of Kahutara School students who were selected for this event!
