Swimming is happening each day this term. This is a part of our learning curriculum so it is expected that tamariki are prepared each day by bringing their togs and towel.


Puanga and Whanake hubs will be walking down to the town pools for instruction in preparation for swimmings sports on Friday 1 March.

Students who are in the wrong uniform, note or not, will be given the correct gear to change into.
