Social media: Staff have had to deal with an increasing number of incidents around messages on social media between students. The messages are extremely vile and nasty. This is happening out of school hours where students aren't being monitored. Social media platforms recommend and/or require users to be at least 13 to have an account. The kura is working with police, ministry and other providers to provide sessions for whaanau around how to keep tamariki safe when online. As we work together whaanau, we ask that you talk with your tamariki around the consequences of online bullying (nasty anonymous messages) and monitor what they are doing. Have a great weekend.
