If your child plays rugby in any of the Te Teko teams and they practice Tuesdays and Thursdays, they will need to provide a note that gives your consent, that can be given to their classroom teacher or Whaea Tuti (road patrol teacher). This is important for health and safety reasons and ensures that your child has permission to attend after kura.

**Kura Uniforms** Uniform items such as shirts, polar fleece vests, jackets, etc can be purchased from NZ Uniforms. Sporting gear from any of our sports clubs around Te Teko are not school uniform so they are discouraged. Please make an effort to ensure that your tamariki have the correct uniform and shoes (black are preferable) as we are seeing lots of tamariki wearing bright
