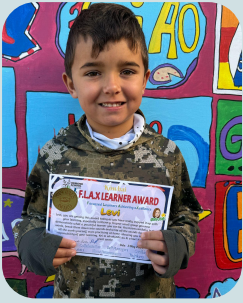

F.L.A.X Award Recipients

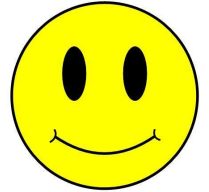
LEVI
