Kia ora Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

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Welcome to the end of the third week of term. It has been another busy week with interschool netball and rugby, Science experiments and Professional Learning Development for our teachers as the highlights of the week.

Teachers are learners. At Ormond School we strive to provide the best learning conditions and pedagogy for our students. Engaging in professional development allows our teachers to grow their teaching kete to be able to better support our students as they progress through their learning journey. All Professional Learning Development (PLD) is linked to our strategic goal to Grow Teacher Capability - *great teachers to deliver great learning* to Grow Learner Capability - *my learning, my way*. Our current Professional Learning Development focuses are currently linked to supporting the current curriculum refresh and the learning themes that are promoted through this. Over this year we have engaged in PLD such as:

Local Stories / Pūrākau to support our local curriculum and Aotearoa Histories curriculum, a Structured Literacy Approach to enhance our literacy curriculum, Field Based STEM to enhance our learning experiences through Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics to provide authentic learning, along with Assessment for Learning that underpins the delivery of teaching and learning at Ormond School and is a key driver of the curriculum refresh, Te Mātaiaho.

We continued our journey of embedding the principles of Assessment for Learning this week as we welcomed our PLD facilitator Joanne Moy, from Evaluative Associates back this week to observe Teachers and their practice. Our journey in Assessment for Learning provides teachers with a pedagogy that allows students to be actively involved in the learning process and providing a framework for teachers to inquire into their practice and provide feedback for continued improvement. Our teachers have been engaged in developing their skills in Practice Analysis Conversations. These conversations are directly based on an aspect of a teachers practice through agreed observation focus with feedback towards the goal of making improvements to have a direct impact on the learner. One aspect of this teacher practice is that of self assessment. Self assessment is a key enabler for learners being in the 'driver's seat' of their learning, rather than being a passive participant. Learners are actively involved in their learning by developing the ability to think deeply about what they have learnt and where this new learning can take them. It was extremely pleasing to hear and observe learners taking ownership for their learning through the use of self assessment. The ability to self assess provides our students with the skill of active reflection and the critical thinking tools to evaluate what has been done well or where improvements are needed to be made to be successful in their learning and to take greater ownership of their learning. We believe that through Growing Great Teachers that we will Grow Great Learners and Great People.
