- Do talk about ways home and the school can work together to help your child learn.
- Do talk about your child's journey as a young Christian this year. How have you seen them mature spiritually?
- X Do not talk about other students that are not your own children. This time is for your child only,
- X Do not take this time to talk about other teachers, the administration or the principal. This time is for your child and its important you focus on them
- X Do not talk about any gossip you may have heard.
- X Do not criticize your child's teacher or your child.

- X Do not take this time to talk about other teachers, the administration or the principal. This time is for you to let those who love you know how school is going for you.
- X Do not talk about any gossip you may have heard.
- X Do not criticise your teachers or parents.

- Do talk about how the student behaves in class. Do they show respect to you and to their peers? Do they listen?
- Do talk about ways home and the school can work together to help the child learn.
- Do talk about the student's journey as a young Christian this year. How have they spiritually matured?
- X Do not talk about other students. Just talk about the one in front of you.
- X Do not take this time to talk about other teachers, the administration, or the principal. You need to focus on the student in front of vou.
- X Do not talk about any gossip you may have heard.
- X Do not criticise your student or their parents.
