We are pleased to provide an update on the significant progress our students have made in securing their Literacy and Numeracy corequisites. These achievements underscore the hard work of our students and the effective support provided by our teaching staff.

The current statistics for corequisite attainment are highly encouraging across all year levels:

Year Level	Literacy Attainment	Numeracy Attainment
Year 10	Nearly 50%	Just over 50%
Year 11	Approximately two-thirds	Approximately two-thirds
Year 12	Just under 80%	Just over 80%
Year 13	90%	90%






Literacy Attainment













Numeracy Attainment
