


ENGLISH FACULTY

It has been a busy start to the year for the English Faculty. We have welcomed a new teacher, Ms Kseniia Opaleva. Ms Opaleva is teaching two Year 9 English classes and a Year 11 class. We also welcome back Mrs Karen Flay who is also teaching a Year 9 English class. We are very lucky to have both these ladies on board this year and wish them well.

Our Year 9 and 10s have kicked off the year with zest by sitting their E-Asttle reading and writing tests. The important information that these tests provide, will help inform our teaching programmes, ensuring we are giving our students the best possible learning opportunities. Next term we will be introducing a new testing regime called SMART testing. Our junior school focus this term is our identity. Within this context we are reading and writing about how we are shaped as individuals. We are immersing our students in many different genres of text including short stories, extended texts, poems and songs. The emphasis will be on understanding the author's purpose and intention, examining how language features contribute to the text's purpose and understanding our own responses to the text. Within a writing lens we are working on narrative structure, PEEL paragraphs and, as always, punctuation and grammar.

The CAA exams are a major event in the life of our Year 10s. The CAA consists of a reading and writing component. Each examination is worth 5 NCEA Level 1 credits. The first set of exams will take place in May and therefore, we are now preparing our learners for this. I expect them all to do themselves proud.

In the senior school our Year 11 cohort are experiencing their first NCEA assessment standard. The new learning and expected level of attainment will initially be a challenge for these students, however, as the term progresses they will settle into the expectations of a new assessment regime. All three levels have begun the year with determination and focus.
