RYDA: ROAD AND SAFETY EDUCATION WORKSHOP.

On Monday, 52 of our Year 12 and 13 tauira travelled to Te Kūiti for a one-day workshop road safety. **Through** interactive workshops and real experiments, Road Safety Education (RSE) challenged our students to view driving as a social responsibility. The Otorohanga College group spent the day identifying risk factors and developing strategies to adapt their driving behaviour accordingly. This included learning about vehicle safety impacts ratings, the speeding, distractions behind the pressure and vulnerable road users. Most memorably for many of our students, they were given the chance to interview a crash survivor in order to investigate the factors leading to the crash.















YEAR 10 GIRLS SELF DEFENCE

This week the Year 10 girls were lucky enough to be invited to attend a Girls' Self Defence Project course run by Kia Haumaru – Personal Safety Education. The kaiako, our amazing former Te Reo Māori teacher, Mel Goodin, supported the girls in learning ways of dealing with unsafe people, situations, and threats to their safety. The Girls' looked at how to give clear boundaries and messages to those both known and unknown to us when feeling unsafe, the importance of trusting our feelings, and listening to our instincts. The girls' identified the difference between healthy, unhealthy and abusive relationships and the importance of telling a trusted adult when things are not right. This learning was reinforced through discussion and development of both verbal and physical skills to help the girls' keep themselves and others safe. A worthwhile experience with loads of learning!

SWIMMING SPORTS

The 2023 Otorohanga College Swimming Sports took place on Tuesday in near perfect conditions at The Otorohanga Pools. It is the first year we have had the full College up at the Swimming Sports for a number of years and students must be commended for their superb participation and support of their Houses. Wintec Trades Academy 2023:

In 2023 the number of students we were able to place at Wintec Trades Academy increased, which means our students have even more opportunities to follow their desired pathways. A total of 35 Year 12 and 13 students have started their WTA journey, enrolled in a number of different courses. Here, at the Ōtorohanga Trades Academy campus, we have the Construction and Infrastructure Level 2 Course as well as the Manufacturing and Technology Level 2 Course. Many of our students travel to the Wintec Rotokauri Hamilton Campus where they attend either Café Skills Level 2, Hair and Beauty Therapy Level 2, Introduction to Professional Cookery Level 3 or Building and Construction Level 3 courses.



Gateway Programmes:

This year, the Pathways Department is focusing on individual Gateway programmes for our students, aiming to customise courses according to specific students' needs. In our first Gateway programme for the year one of our students was given the opportunity to work at New Zealand Riding for the Disabled, locally, while completing a Level 2 Equine Unit Standard.



We have also had interest in numerous other Gateway opportunities such as the SEEDS Retail Countdown programme, Automotive pathway, Barista / Hospitality, Agriculture and Tourism (Māori Waitomo Cultural Camp). This will continue throughout Term 2 and 3.

Other exciting news:

Number Twelve is assisting our students with their licences. Some of our students have already completed their Learner's Licence. This is arranged on a weekly basis. Number Twelve is also arranging driving lessons and assisting students with their Restricted, Full and Defensive Licences.
