Year 10 students are focusing on language related to time and weather. This unit helps them develop practical skills in expressing when things happen and describing environmental conditions—important parts of everyday conversation.

Our senior students are making excellent progress in korero (spoken interaction). They are practicing speaking with one another, aiming to grow their confidence and fluency in using Te Reo Māori with their peers. This focus on real communication is an exciting step forward in their language journey.
