We took precautions with any sand that was suspected to be part of this recall. We isolated it and on the initial inspection by an expert he feels what we have is safe. We will know for sure once it is fully tested. This sand has been sold to preschools, schools and also it could be purchased from different outlet stores to the general public. Some of the sand found here did come from homes, purchased by parents. There is a high probability that it is ok, but you can't take that risk. If you have purchased this sand, you may need to follow the steps in this newsletter.

From time to time, we get an outbreak of scabies. We have not had one for a long time. Please, be vigilant and read the information attached to this newsletter. Also, as a reminder, nits are always a problem in any school, but we do have available, free, hair product and combs to treat them. Please contact your child's teacher or the office if you are in need.

We also had sKids (a before and after school care organisation) who were very busy face painting. Where can I dispose of the recalled rainbow sand?

Do not dispose the recalled magic sand into your kerbside red rubbish bin At all of our Transfer Stations head to the kiosk and let the staff know you are disposing of asbestos contaminated material and they will take you through the process.

Before bringing any products to the drop-off point, ensure you place the sand in a sealed container, then double-bag in thick plastic or in multiple layers of plastic wrap, seal with tape, and clearly label as "Asbestos-Contaminated Material".

There is no charge to people for disposing of the recalled magic sand.
