

#### NZ FIFA SOCCER PLAYER

BORN: 22 April 1995

FULL NAME: Catherine Joan Bott

CAREER: Bott plays for New Zealand in the FIFA Women's World Cup

#### Personal Life

Bott was a member of the New Zealand U-17 team at the 2012 Women's World Championships, playing in two of New Zealand's group games.

At the 2014 Women's World Championships in Canada, Bott played in all three of New Zealand's group games and the quarter final match that they lost to Nigeria.

She was part of New Zealand's squad for the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup in Canada. She scored her first full international goal, a powerful strike from 35 metres against Argentina at the 2019 Cup of Nations in Brisbane, Australia, on March 3rd, 2019.

She was also part of New Zealand's squad for the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup in France, but sadly broke her arm in the second game of the group stage against Canada.



#### **Interesting Facts**

- Bott has had the most attempted line breaks out of her whole team with a total of 79 attempted line breaks.
- She is a defender
- New Zealand's nickname is called the Football Ferns.


### Famous New Zealanders
