




### Attendance

The rate of regular student attendance in New Zealand is quite low compared to many other nations. In response, the Ministry of Education has introduced the Stepped Attendance Response (STAR) initiative to assist schools and whānau in improving attendance. The STAR program:

- Establishes a framework ensuring that no student accumulates absences without an appropriate intervention to facilitate their return to regular attendance.
- Aims to help achieve the Government's goal of having 80% of students present for 90% of the term by 2030.
- Outlines the necessary actions to take when students are absent from school.
- This initiative emphasizes the importance of school attendance, stating that:
  - Parents are expected to collaborate with the school, the Ministry, and other relevant agencies to help their children return to regular attendance and engage with available support.
  - Schools and the Ministry of Education will take necessary actions when student absences become a concern.

The STAR initiative clarifies the steps to be taken when students do not attend school, fostering a shared understanding among all stakeholders.



Attendance reminders to help our school processes run smoothly:

- 1. Absentees to be entered onto Skool Loop or emailed before 9am each morning with an explanation for absense
- 2. The office will send a text message if we have not recieved notofication of childs absense please respond asap so that record of absense can be made (no explanation the child will be marked truant)
- 3. Late students- parents must go to the office to sign their child in if arriving after 9am
- 4. Picking up students early parents must go to office to sign child out if leaving school early
- 5. If someone different is picking up your child early please let office or teacher know so we know they have your permission.
