Notice of 2026 Operational Contributions

Dear Parents/Caregivers, You may have read in the latest Board Newsletter about the decision made

at the November

Board meeting to re-instate asking families for a voluntary operational contribution (also known as "school donations" or "school fees") in 2026 as per our Income Policy (username: stpatstaupo password: faith). The level of contribution requested is reviewed by the Board at the end of each year and communicated to enrolled families

Our school does not qualify for the Government Donation scheme and as such, we are reliant on sourcing additional funds in order to fund the programs, resources and experiences for our students that our government funding just doesn't cover.

Operational contributions are an important part of this. We have been able toavoid requesting these contributions since 2020 due to having some surplus funds, but needtore-instate the requests for 2026. I wish to assure you that the Board has not taken this decisionlightly, and have tried to keep the amount requested as reasonable as possible. In 2026, the school office will send families a request at the start of each term for an operational contribution of \$25 per student per term, with a maximum of \$50 per family per term. This equates to a maximum of \$5 per term time week per family throughout the year. These contributions are voluntary, and qualify for donation tax credits. These contributions are not to be confused with the attendance dues (compulsory) and Catholic character contribution (voluntary) that you are invoiced for by the Catholic Integrated Schools Office (CISO) each year. I have attached an explanation of the different fees you will be asked to pay in 2026, what they are for, and which are compulsory to this letter. We acknowledge that times are hard for some of our whānau, and not all will be able to afford these requests. We thank you for your support and understanding in this matter. Yours sincerely,

The deeper meaning


Christmas is more than presents and food. For Catholics it means


