#### Carpark

Over the past couple of weeks I have received correspondence from some parents around safety issues when dropping off and picking children up, especially on wet days. ### The Importance of Advent for Catholics

As we enter the season of Advent, the beginning of the Church's liturgical year, we are reminded that this is a special time of preparation and hope for Catholics around the world. For Catholics, Advent is much more than counting down to Christmas — it is a season that invites us to pause, reflect, and prepare our hearts.

#### A Season of Hope

The four candles of the Advent wreath help us mark the weeks leading up to Christmas. With each candle we light, the light grows brighter, reminding us that hope increases as we draw closer to the celebration of Jesus' birth. Many classes use this time to reflect on what they are hopeful for and how they can bring hope to others.



#### **Preparing Our Hearts**

Advent encourages us to "make room" for Jesus in our daily lives. Students and families often take part in

simple acts of kindness—helping a friend, donating food or gifts, or showing patience and compassion. Many parishes also offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent to help people prepare spiritually for Christmas.

#### Remembering the Nativity

Throughout Advent, our Scripture readings and classroom discussions help us remember the story of Mary, Joseph, and the journey to Bethlehem. Students may take part in nativity plays, prayer services, and reflections that bring the Christmas story to life and remind us of God's great love shown through the birth of Jesus.

#### Living With Christ Today

Advent also reminds us that Jesus is with us now — through prayer, through the people who care for us, and in the moments when we choose kindness and justice. Many schools support service projects at this time of year, helping children understand that caring for others is one way to welcome Jesus into our world.

Looking Forward With Faith

The early weeks of Advent focus on being ready and staying awake for Christ's return. This doesn't mean waiting in fear, but living with purpose, responsibility, and love. Students learn that every good choice—big or small—helps to build a world filled with peace and goodness.
