We encourage you all to come along, meet the teachers and spend a little time with them in their classrooms to find out about routines, expectations and what will be happening in the classes for your children. Bring along picnic blankets and some food to share.





2024 Classrooms for your children

Please can you ask your children what classroom number they are in. It is important when ordering from Lunch Online and when ringing in to the school to leave messages or report absentees to have the correct classroom number.

Cellphones at school

You may be aware through the media, that cellphones are discouraged at school. If your child brings a cellphone to school, it <u>must</u> be handed into the teacher, who will then return it at the end of the day. The phones are not to be used after school while waiting for the bus or being collected from outside the front of the school. If a child is found to be breaking the rules and not handing the phone in, it will be confiscated and parents rung.



Drop off and pick up

Please be very careful when dropping off and picking up children and be considerate of others. The car park can be a very dangerous area and you need to note the speed limit and drive slowly. Remember to use the pedestrian crossing when you can. Children need to be collected from outside the hall after school - they cannot just walk to the car when a parent beckons them. No bikes or scooters are to be ridden across the court areas and no balls or games to be played after school in this area - including when they are with their parents. This is so we can keep all children safe after school.

Year 4 - 8 Choir

Kaylene Carson will be forming a school choir this year. It will be on a Tuesday morning from 8:30 to 9:15. More details to come soon.

Correct uniform

We are starting the year as we want to carry on, with high expectations for all our children. Therefore all staff will be talking to the children about wearing the correct uniform and having pride in being a St Pat's student. They will be reminded at break times as well.

Some things to take note of:

- 1. Hats must be worn during Term 1 & 4 when the sun is at its most dangerous. Sunscreen should be applied before the children come to school but each classroom has a bottle of sunscreen which can be used by the children should they need it.
- 2. Jewellery is restricted to personal items, along these guidelines, to allow for safety.
 - Rings not allowed.
 - Bracelets and necklaces are if it is a necessity eg. Medic alert, taonga, simple cross.
 - Watches are allowed but SMART watches are not to be used at school as phones.
 - Earrings, if worn, must be studs. ONLY 1 EARRING per ear.

Dispensation from these guidelines can be given at the Principal's discretion.

- 3. Long hair is to be kept off the face. Hair ties or head bands are to be worn depending on hair length. Hair ties must support the school colours ie navy, black or maroon.
- 4. Plain black school shoes or sandals with no glitter, no white soles or logos on them, are suitable. Please ensure <u>ALL SHOES ARE NAMED</u>

From time to time it may be necessary for your child to come to school not wearing the correct uniform. At these times, a note must be sent from home to let the school know the reason.

Website and Skool Loop

We use Skool Loop as our app alert and now our school website will also powered by Skool Loop. We are currently updating the website and it is due to replace our current website next week. This will mean that current and upcoming events will be available on both sites. Please make use of this to keep your calendars up to date. We will be adding more information and new photos to our website on a regular basis and encourage you to use and share it.

Year 7 & 8 technology

As mentioned last year, our contract with Taupo-nui-a-tia has concluded and the school will be running their own technology classes each Tuesday during the middle block. This is going to be an exciting initiative and we will be able to offer more options for technology. A flyer will be sent out to all Y7/8 students' families later this week.



Kapa Haka tutor

We are very pleased to have secured Mātua Grant to tutor our senior Kapa Haka this year. Charlene Ede has been a fabulous tutor for our Kapa Haka and we commend her for her dedication. She and Hayleigh-Anne Pine will now take the non performing children for te reo / tikanga lessons while Mātua Grant tutors our performance group.

Ephesians 4:32 - We show kindness


Be kind and tender-hearted to one another, and forgive one another, as God has forgiven you through Christ.


