### **Uniform expectations**


At the end of last term I sent out an email about uniform expectations. We have already noticed a few children arriving with the wrong uniform.

# Term 3: RE Reflection Grandparents Day 2024




Grandparents day we celebrated the Feast of St Anne and St Joachim, the grandparents of Jesus.

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary with a whole school mass.



The winner will be drawn at random and announced at our assembly on Friday 2 August.



### THE WHY

"Our whānau support worker was referred a woman living in emergency housing with her children. She had previously been in an abusive relationship, lost a lot of confidence and became reliant on drugs. Her eldest child was not consistently attending school, and attended mostly late and without food. Buying food for her children was not a priority. She has since reconnected with her whānau, and is sending the kids to school on time and with food. She is now a lot happier and has a much better relationship with her children and family."

"The grant from Common Good enabled us to take on two new clients. One was a 12 year old girl who had a life of parental neglect...drugs and alcohol abuse. She had been to nine schools by the time she was 9 years old. She has engaged with the mentoring program, and received counselling and therapy sessions. After one session, she said "I haven't had a day like today in a long time. Have you ever had a day where it just gets better and better and you are feeling on such a high?"
