
Vicki Saunders Principal - Relieving

# The Power of PENTECOST



Following the Holy Spirit, Catholic's learn to share God's Love everyday:

Pentecost is important to Catholics because it marks the day the Holy Spirit came to the apostles, giving birth to the Church. It reminds us that God's Spirit is with us, guiding and strengthening us in our faith. On this day, we celebrate the power of the Holy Spirit to unite people of all languages and cultures.

Pentecost helps us understand the Fruits of the Spirit

- 1. **The Holy Spirit at Pentecost** gave the apostles the courage, wisdom, and love to spread Jesus' message—this is the beginning of how the fruits started to show in their lives (e.g., **love**, **joy**, **peace**).
- 2. "God's Spirit is with us" means that just like the apostles, we can receive the Holy Spirit and grow in the fruits such as faithfulness, patience, and kindness in our daily lives.
- 3. Unity of people of all languages and cultures shows the Spirit's work through gentleness, peace, and self-control, promoting harmony and understanding.
- 4. Understanding the fruits teaches us how to live like Jesus. The fruits are signs that we are living by the Holy Spirit and acting as true disciples.
- 5. Sharing God's love through our actions is how the fruits become visible—when we show generosity, kindness, and goodness, we live out Pentecost in the world today.

So, the Pentecost event is not just about what happened to the apostles—it teaches us how to grow and show the Fruits of the Spirit in our own lives.

#### WHAT DO **BOARD MEMBERS DO?**

Board members work together to make sure every child/ tamariki reaches their highest possible standard in educational achievement. As part of that key responsibility, here are some of the things

- boards do:

  Work with the principal and consult with staff, students and the community
- Set the educational goals and strategic direction of the school
- Monitor progress and let parents know how the school is progressing against its annual targets and how well students are achieving
- · Decide how the school's funding will be
- Support the school's principal and support the development of all staff
- Oversee the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.

For our board to be the best it can be we need people around the board table with a range of these competencies, skills and personal qualities:

- Visionary leadership Strategic thinkers
- Analytical thinkers
- Practical people People who can communicate well
- Team players

#### HELPFUL SKILLS

- Legal understanding
- · Risk management
- People management
   Knowledge of education environment

#### PERSONAL QUALITIES

- Integrity Curiosity
- Courage
- Interpersonal skills
  Genuine interest in the school and its students
- Time and commitment · Willingness to learn

It is not expected that each trustee will have all of these skills, but a range of skills around the board table is essential.

#### 7s Rugby Tour Movie Fundraiser


