## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

### Thursday 28 May

A chilly welcome to the second half of term 2, being only a 9 week term it is already over half way through. Our senior students from Toki Hub, enjoyed beautiful weather for their EOTC experience last week visiting the National Army Museum in Waiouru as part of their ANZAC studies. We thank everyone who was able to provide transport and supervision, such visits are not possible without this support.

### **Teacher Recruitment and Supply**

Last week the local Central Plateau Principal's Association published the below letter. Here at St. Patrick's we are very fortunate to be fully staffed and very grateful that your children have regular teachers in their classrooms. However, we are, at times, affected by the relief teacher shortage and on some days we are unable to find cover for illness and classes need to be shared / split between other classes. We thank you for your understanding on these occasional days.

### To the Taupō Community - From Your Local School Principals

Kia ora Taupō whānau,

Like you, we all want Taupō to continue being the best place it can be to live, work, and go to school. Our schools play a vital role in that vision — shaping the futures of our young people and strengthening our community. As the Principals and Boards of schools across the Taupō rohe, we write together to share an urgent issue affecting all our kura — the national shortage of qualified teachers.

Despite our ongoing efforts to recruit and support new staff, there is an increasing teacher supply challenge to meet the growing needs of our schools. This is putting a real strain on our ability to deliver the quality education our ākonga deserve.

Across the rohe, some schools are having to make difficult decisions: collapsing classes, combining year levels, or rostering students home. These measures are temporary and only taken when absolutely necessary, but we know they cause disruption for students, whānau, and staff.

Still, our commitment remains strong — to provide safe, high-quality learning environments for all. Yet at times, the staffing shortage means we cannot meet even our own expectations.

To give context:

- The average number of NZ-trained applicants per vacancy has halved since 2019.
- Around one-third of school vacancies remain unfilled.
- 33% of advertised roles in 2023 had no NZ-trained applicants; 31% had only one.
- Relief teacher availability is at record lows for our community.

- The uniform is very expensive so should be used to encourage personal care and tidiness.

### JEWELLERY/MAKE UP

### Investing in improved attendance

The government has recently announced an investment of almost \$140 million over the next four years to improve student attendance. This includes \$123 million for the delivery of a new attendance service and almost \$17 million to support and strengthen front-line attendance services.

New front-line attendance services will include comprehensive local attendance services funded to reach double the current number of chronically absent and non-enrolled students, and an option of some in-school provision for schools with very high numbers of chronically absent students. The new services will be in place by early 2026.



We know that fundamental movement activities help develop the holistic brain. When we cross our mid-line, we are giving both sides of the brain the opportunity to "talk" to each other. This is crucial in developing a dominant hand and a helping hand. When underdeveloped this can impact on a child's reading and writing.

#### June 17th Workshop 2: Proprioception System (Spatial Awareness)

As a child learns to move, they begin to become aware of their body parts, where their body is in relation to the physical environment around them, and what their body looks like. When a child has opportunities to move in a variety of environments they learn about spatial awareness.

#### June 24th Workshop 3: Balance & Coordination (Vestibular)

A child's vestibular system needs to be activated and stimulated throughout life. This inner ear system impacts on a person's ability to control balance and coordination.
