This term, we've seen some more changes in our curriculum, with a particular focus on adapting to the refreshed curriculum framework. I had the opportunity to attend via livestream, the Curriculum Roadshow, where I gained some more insight into these changes and how they will impact both our teaching practices and students' learning experiences. Our recent Teacher-Only Day was also a valuable chance for our staff to come together and unpack the updates to the maths curriculum. The discussions we had around these changes were very productive, and it's clear that our teachers are committed to ensuring these new approaches enhance the way we support our students in their learning. As we continue to engage with these changes, we will keep our school community informed on progress.

We were excited to host a visit from a group of Japanese students Clark High School in Japan through the exchange programme at IPU, which was a wonderful opportunity for a different cultural experience. Our school welcomed them with a warm mihi whakatau, creating a connection between our students and our guests. After this, our visitors treated us to demonstrations of traditional Japanese activities, including kendama, origami, and calligraphy. In return, our students proudly shared some of our own cultural practices, showcasing their skills with rakau and poi. It was a great day, filled with learning and connection, and a reminder of how cultural exchange broadens our understanding of the world. We look forward to more opportunities like this in the future!

For National Play Week, we celebrated the power of play, helping our students grow, learn, and connect. Thanks to a grant from Tu Manawa, we were able to purchase a range of

loose parts play gear - things like ropes, wooden batons, and tarps - that let our kids get creative and build their own fun. Loose parts play is all about giving students the freedom to explore and collaborate, and it's been awesome to see how the new gear has sparked their imaginations!

The Mobile Dental Unit will be visiting Tokomaru School from Tuesday, 11 November 2025 and will be running 3 days a week to examine and provide preventative oral treatment (cleaning, fissure sealants, x-rays and fluoride treatment) where required for patients due for their annual check.

Students requiring further treatment, (fillings and extractions) will be sent an information pamphlet, medical history update form and consent form. These will need to be signed and returned to either the Mobile or the school office before any treatment is undertaken.

The Home & School Association run most of our fundraising events and help raise money for our school and tamariki.


