Attendance

Swimming

A wet bag must be provided, be it a plastic bag or something else that is suitable, not a paper bag, and please name this as well. We spend far too much time looking for gear and accumulating a pile that suddenly becomes our problem when it has come out of your homes. We really want to improve on this. Swimming is part of the curriculum and we take it very seriously as we build up water fitness and safety before students head into the summer break.

Dr Shane Reti

We have had several queries regarding Hon Dr Shane Reti's recent Facebook post about supplementary funding for schools in Whangārei. We'd like to briefly explain how this funding works. Every five years, each state school receives property funding based on two things: the square meterage of its buildings and the assessed condition of those buildings. If more repair work is required than funding allows for, supplementary funding is available.

The buildings at Te Kamo School are in excellent condition overall. This is due to the funding we've received in recent years and to our diligence with ongoing maintenance. This year, our need for extra repairs is low and our supplementary funding reflects this.

Mara Manaaki Food Forest – Midweek Progress Update

Kia ora whānau,

We're thrilled to share that the Mara Manaaki food forest installation is officially underway at Kamo Primary!

After a weather-based shift, our prep day took place today — and what a transformation. A massive thank you to **Yvonne and Doug Vause from GroundsCare**, who brought in their machinery to rotary hoe the entire site and stump grind the large obstacle in the middle. Their mahi has been instrumental in preparing the whenua for planting.

Our tamariki have been out in force, helping pull out grass and clear the area. **Frida and Sean**, our expert designers and installers, are now shaping the beds and guiding the layout for Friday's planting day. There's been plenty of barrowing — compost, mulch, and wood chip are being moved into place, and the site is coming alive.

This kaupapa is about more than planting trees — it's about growing community food resilience, creating a living classroom, and empowering tamariki to take what they learn home.

Planting Day is this Friday, 31st October, and we'd love your help with tools, labour, or simply cheering us on.

We also want to again acknowledge the incredible support from our wider community:
