Mid Year Progress Reports

At the end of Week 9 you will receive mid-year progress reports for your children. Please note, these are progress reports at this time of year and achievement reports are at the end of the year. We are not aiming for a one-way reporting process, we ask that you read the report and then meet with the teacher to exchange reciprocal information, ask questions, and think forward for your children. Teachers are very keen to meet you all to discuss your children's progress to date. The Ministry of Education states that schools report to parents and whānau for two key reasons:

- Parents and whānau are key stakeholders in education and as such they expect meaningful information about their child's progress and achievement in relation to learning entitlements set out in The New Zealand Curriculum.
- Parents, families, whānau, and wider community have a valuable role to play in supporting their children's learning at and beyond school.

Effective reporting of student/ākonga progress and achievement across the curriculum requires more than one-way transmission of information from teacher or student to parent. It requires meaningful, ongoing information sharing processes where the roles and expectations of students/ākonga, teachers, parents, whānau, and the wider community are clear.

Parent/Whānau Interviews - Week 10

On Tuesday 2nd July and Wednesday 3rd July of Week 10, we have Parent/Whānau Interviews. The interviews start at 1pm and at end at 5pm. This means school will finish at 1pm on both of those days. We ask you to read your children's reports and then bring them to discuss at your booked interview time. There are still spaces so please do not hesitate to book using our Skool Loop app.

Behaviour

When a behaviour occurs at school, as equally upset as your child and yourself will be, so are the staff at KPS. We strive to constantly create a supportive and safe learning environment. But impulsivity is something we do not have control over. We have School Values, PB4L, a Behaviour Policy, a Learning Support Co-ordinator, a SENCo, weekly teaching to behaviour, notes on our system to support external supports and a Senior Leadership Team working constantly to support. We are intent on always striving for a safe place of learning. Please know that we are striving to meet the need of students with impulsive behaviour.

Whaea Sally is funny because she tells jokes and she likes to hang out with the kids. She is famous because she runs the school. Tai Livingstone





Structured Literacy - Vocabulary



Spend time consciously discussing new word meanings with your children when you read together. Even picture books can be great opportunities to extend vocabulary knowledge.
