### PRINCIPAL'S EDUCATIONAL COMMENT

- TE WHAIKŌRERO O TE TUMUAKI

#### ONLINE SAFETY CONCERNS FOR TAMARIKI

As the digital revolution continues to sweep through workplaces, classrooms and homes, it is our young people who remain the most vulnerable to harm. I have had a number of parents recently talk to me about the concerns they have with their child's involvement in the social media world.

Many parents continue to look to schools and teachers to put boundaries in place, however there is now the growing awareness and continued struggle over screen time boundaries and behaviours at home. Technology brings with it many benefits for convenience, choice, and connectivity, but unfortunately it can also be used to harm.

The reality that I am becoming more aware of is that many children often have free reign and unsupervised online access. This freedom can be an unsafe space that can impact the mental and physical well-being of tamariki.

A study carried out by Netsafe shows that nearly four in ten New Zealand kids have had contact online with someone they didn't know, and one in ten have gone on to meet someone in person who they encountered online; 23 percent of these children were under 11 years old. The study also reported that whilst issues around online activities and their repercussions are a constant and increasing source of concern for parents, up to 43 percent of the parents do not actively monitor the content, platforms or activities their children engage in online. The study suggests younger children need more active help to protect their safety online to help them develop safety skills before their internet usage likely changes as they head into teenage hood.

My request to you all is simply take the time to set up safety systems and monitoring of your child's internet access at home. Become AWARE.

Kia ora koutou katoa/ Hello everyone

Here is an update on the Māra Kai/School gardens. Our awesome caretaker and Mr Pete pitched in to weed the rest of our school gardens.

- 1. We have two worm farms up and running. Our Envirokidz Shraddhaba, Jesse-James, Siena, Zack, Zayne and Danielle worked hard with Helen our Enviro teacher to do this.
- 2. We recycle milk bottles from the staffroom to fill with the worm tea which will be great for our gardens
- 3. We have 2 food scrap buckets, one in the staffroom and one in Room 17 to feed the worm farms daily.
- 4. Helen came in and taught us about what is actually waste. We checked out our lunch boxes and realized there is hardly any waste that needs to be going to our landfills!!!!
- 5. Kūmara seedlings that were grown by Room 5 last year and planted out by Mrs Miller and Mrs Lowe are now ready to harvest. Take a look at the photo and the size of one of the kūmara which we will turn into kūmara chips and eat.
- 6. We are looking forward to seeing how our own compost containers will go and to use that compost soil to plant and grow our sunflower seeds that we harvested while weeding the gardens.
- 7. Finally, our next Room 17 envirokidz, Reon, Morgan, Skyla, Dom, Riley, Jake, Mia, Gurtaj, getting the project of the school compost bins ready to go. Mr Pete will be putting up our Garden shed to house all our garden tools, building a potting bench, so that many more from the school can use this wonderful resource created by Mrs Blakesley and past parents.
