## PRINCIPALS EDUCATIONAL COMMENT

#### Ki ora koutou

Just to keep you all informed my shoulder operation to reattach the tender was very successful, however I am required to wear a rather large shoulder sling for at least six weeks, which is quite a daunting task.

Recently the Board met with a group from the Hastings Council to discuss the current road dilemma occurring outside our school and all along Howard Street. Unfortunately they were not in a position to guarantee us a timeframe for the completion of all the activities occurring on the road front (these consist of complete upgrade of infrastructures such as sewage lines, storm water, power and fibre for the new roadage being developed on the land adjacent to the school) At this stage it will be continuing for at least the next two or three months.

What has been positive from the discussions has been an agreement with the council to work with the school to future proof the safety along Howard Street outside our school for our students. This will involve the construction of four 'raised platforms' (speed bumps) with signage to ensure vehicles stay at a reduced speed limit along our school frontage. They will also be 'raising the current zebra crossing' outside our school to improve visibility and restrict vehicle speed. A further by our crossing addition will be the establishment of 'planter boxes' in our no parking areas by our crossing to ensure they remain a non-parking zone.

Until these new additions are built and while the major road works continue, we ask that you all put "CHILD SAFETY" ahead of all other actions. Be patient and tolerant as well as considerate of others so that we can all get through this frustrating situation together.
