

#### SCHOOL REMINDERS - NGĀ MAUMAHARA

#### Lice / Nits

We are experiencing a number of complaints of lice and itchy scalps among our ākonga. Please be vigilant in checking your child/rens hair and inform your teacher if you spot any or treat your child/ren. Lice can become a long term issue for some whānau if not eradicated completely but lice are nothing to be ashamed of. If you need help with nit shampoo or combs please visit me in the office - or - if you think you might need a hand getting lice out of your home please reach out!



#### Handy helpers with lice:

- 1. Shampoo using a lice shampoo or another smothering agent, also treat all family members in the home. Repeat this process in 10 days.
- 2. Comb comb each strand of hair to remove louse and their eggs, this might need to be done multiple times a day to ensure you are getting everything.
- 3. Defend Tie long hair for school, use a nit deterrent like tea tree oil or "Nitenz" products, encourage your child to use their OWN HAT at school
- 4. Blitz wash all bedding including pillowcases and sheets, headwear and anything else that may have come in contact with the lice.



#### **POIPOI MOKOPUNA**

A six-session programme for parents and caregivers of children who are experiencing attachment and trauma related issues. This programme provides information about child development, attachment, the effects of trauma, abuse, loss and neglect, and develops caregivers' self-reflective capacity. It supports participants to develop parenting skills to better manage and understand the child's behaviour, and provides a platform for establishing a support network for caregivers.

A seven-session interactive programme for parents and caregivers of children aged 3-11 years old.
