




NUI NEWS - NGĀ PĀNUI O TE NGĀ RĀKAU NUI

presenting a report at the school assembly to update the rest of the school on what is being done so far, what we can do next and why we need to minimize waste going to the landfill.


Karawhiua tamariki mā!!

Why We Need to Minimize Waste by Lucas Post - Year 4

We learnt that there is a Great Pacific Garbage patch and landfills full of rubbish. The great Pacific Garbage patch is the same size as Texas, so we need to minimize waste. It's mostly plastic in this garbage patch. Plastic never goes away so we need less plastic and more recyclable stuff. Plastic can break down and it turns into this thing called microplastic. Microplastic goes into the fish. We eat the fish, so we are eating microplastic. Microplastic will hurt sea animals. Rubbish can't decompose in landfills because there is so much plastic. For example chippy packets are plastic and they never break down or go away. Rubbish makes an acid called leachate. It just sits in a pool at the landfill. We need to protect our water, health and our land.

Everyone can do something. The government needs to minimize waste. I know it's hard but we can't live like this forever. We need to stop using plastic wrappings. It is going to the dump then the landfill! We can reuse by getting second hand things, reuse containers, bags and cups and stuff.
