Your child's report now reflects their progress within these new phases of learning, which may appear different from previous reports that referred to the old curriculum levels.

We will be holding **Three-Way Conferences** on **Tuesday 15th July**, which will be an invaluable opportunity for students, parents, and teachers to discuss achievements, set goals, and collaboratively plan next steps. It will also be an opportunity to ask your child's teacher any questions you might have about the mid-year report. Chick Orders and supplies

Orders for day old chicks must be into the school office by Friday 27 June (last day of term 2) order forms have been sent, are available in the school office and have also been sent out on Skool Loop. Chicks will arrive for collection early August, date to be confirmed. We will need a named shoebox on the morning of the delivery to safely transport your chick home. If you have chick crumble please have some ready with your collection box.

Lamb/Calf/Goat

Please remember that your new animal must be born between the 1st of July and 15th September if you are planning to start your training during the school holidays. Please pop in and pick up an information pack from the office which will give you all the information you require on rearing and training your animal. Animal registration is available on Skool Loop forms.


We cannot stress enough that we do need someone to fill this spot. Without your support, Waitoki can't register any children for Group Day this year as per the rules.

We're at that time of the year again where we start Cross Country training! Training will take place starting from mid June (weather permitting).

Winter Sickness

It's that time again when illness and bugs are about. This is just a reminder that if your child is unwell please keep them at home. Also to let the school office know via skool loop, *daily* if your child is off for multiple days, along with the symptoms so we can keep tabs on anything going around.

Skool Loop App

Please make sure that you download the Skool Loop app on your phone if you haven't already, and subscribe to any relevant groups.

To download the free app, find it in to your Play store or App store and search for Waitoki School. To subscribe to groups, go in to Settings > Subscribe to Groups > Select your child's teacher, and any other groups you are interested in receiving notifications for e.g. sport.



School Bus service:

Students that live in the Waitoki School zone are entitled to bus transport to and from school if a bus service is available. Bus travel can be arranged at the school office. Pupils must get on and off at their usual stop. The school must be contacted if there is any variance from the above. Wait for your child on the same side of the road that the bus stops.

The school is not responsible for the safety of your child while they are travelling from their house to the bus stop, waiting for a bus to pick them up, or after they have got off the bus on the way home. Someone must see your child both on and off the bus; if not one is there to collect your child, the bus will return the student back to school.

Don't forget to collect your yummy stickers which earn us points to purchase sports equipment at the end of the year. The office have collection pages for the stickers.




