Enrolments for 2026

The Waitoki School Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Waitoki School for 2026.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the Waitoki School office.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is 3pm on Wednesday 8th October 2025. Application forms are available from the school website or by emailing admin@waitoki.school.nz

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The board has determined that 50 places are likely to be available for out-of-zone students in 2026. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Wednesday 15th October 2025.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

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
