We really appreciate your support.

Our **open morning** last week went well and we received plenty of positive feedback from those who were able to attend. We were asked when we are going to hold another one so we have already set a date for Term 3, **Thursday 11th September**. This will be another opportunity to come along, look around all our classrooms, meet the teachers and see our local Waitoki School curriculum in action. This will be followed by morning tea in the hall and a chance to have an informal chat with classroom teachers.

On **Thursday 22nd May**, we will be holding our annual **Garden to Table Bake sale** to raise much needed funds for this fabulous programme. Please come along to support us, as there will be a range of yummy sweet and savory goods to buy on the deck just outside the staffroom, from **2.20pm**.

Teachers are currently in the process of gathering Reading, Writing and Maths assessment data in preparation for writing **mid-year reports** to show parents their children's progress and achievement for the first half of 2025. The written reports will be sent home with your child on the last day of this term, **Friday 27th June**, along with an explanation of the report and your child's attendance data for the first half of the year.

Teachers began teaching the refreshed Maths and English curriculum at the beginning of February 2025 and this will be the first time they are reporting to parents against the new curricula. The curriculum and assessment methods are different this year and as a result, you could see a change in progress or achievement compared to previous years. You may have read some information about this in the media as this is something that has been found nationally and not just at Waitoki School. There will be an opportunity to discuss the report and your child's learning goals with their class teacher at the **three way conferences** (student/parent/teacher) on **Tuesday 15th July**.

I hope you will be able to come and join us for our next **school assembly** at **8.45am** on **Monday 26th May**. Tea and coffee will be available, so please come along and celebrate our tamariki's successes.



School Photos



Pool key Reminder

As the School Pool has now closed please return your pool key with your bank account number by 31st May for a refund of the bond.

Disabled Parking Spaces

Please do not park in the disabled parking spaces in the carpark unless you have a permit. We have parents who need to use the spaces at pick up/drop off time. Thank you.

Skool Loop App

Please make sure that you download the Skool Loop app on your phone if you haven't already, and subscribe to any relevant groups.

To download the free app, find it in to your Play store or App store and search for Waitoki School. To subscribe to groups, go in to Settings > Subscribe to Groups > Select your child's teacher, and any other groups you are interested in receiving notifications for e.g. sport.

Enrolment Information: We have already begun the process for 2026 enrolments. If you live out of zone (OOZ) and have a younger child due to start school in 2026 you will need to complete an OOZ application form. Please pop into the office and see either Sarah or Sue to collect one. We do still have a few OOZ spaces left for 2025 if you are wanting to enroll your child this year.

Yummy Stickers

Don't forget to collect your yummy stickers which earn us points to purchase sports equipment at the end of the year. The office have collection pages for the stickers.



Student safety using the school bus service:

Reminders for parents and caregivers:

- Caregivers are responsible for safely transporting their children to and from their school bus stop and as such are best placed to decide the safest way to do this.
- Stick to the speed limit: it's 20kph when passing a stopped school bus (on either side of the road).
- Drop your tamariki off on the same side of the road as the bus stop.
- Teach your tamariki to always get out of the car on the side closest to
- Always take your tamariki to and from the bus-stop.
- Teach your tamariki not to run across the road.
- Remind your tamariki on how to keep safe boarding and disembarking the bus:
- While waiting at the bus stop, keep well back from the road.
- Wait until the bus has completely stopped and the door opens before getting on.
- After getting off the bus, stand well back from the road and wait until the bus has gone and you can see clearly before moving.




