# Grit Ownership Aroha Teamwork

### Tēnā koutou Whānau,

We have been celebrating more student success over the past two weeks. Following on from their success at the Kaipara swimming sports, two students, **Danielle Simpson** and **Theo McDowell** went on to represent Waitoki School and compete in the Northwest Schools Swimming Championships at Westwave on Monday 17th March. Well done to Theo and Danielle, we are all proud of you.



As part of their science inquiry learning, the Junior students in Y0 - Y3 are all going on an EOTC visit to **Kelly Tarltons** on **Wednesday 26th March**. The focus of the trip will be to learn more about the impact of pollution on marine animals. In addition to having time to explore the sealife at Kelly Tarltons, the students will all have a classroom session with one of their educators. I am looking forward to hearing all about it when they return to school.

On Wednesday 19th March, Mr Hillman took our eight Herd Leaders to the **GRIP leadership conference** in Browns Bay. The students had a great day and learnt about the responsibilities of a student leader, developing resilience as a leader of a herd, as well as games they could play with younger students. Our tamariki found the conference beneficial for developing their leadership skills.

As part of the Health and PE curriculum and to support student well-being, Pat Fruean, a former Board member and Paisley's Poppa, has volunteered to come into school and run the **High Intensity Impact Training** (HIIT) programme with all our Y4 - Y8 students. The HIIT programme involves meditation, short bursts of intense exercise to music, flexibility, form and technique. Each of the senior classes are taking part in a bi-weekly 25 minute long session. Chelsea Brown, our DP, is attending all of these sessions along with the class teachers. Pat is also doing some sports coaching at lunchtime as well. Thank you Pat for your support of our tamariki and kura.

The professional learning and development focus for teachers at Waitoki for 2025 is the implementation of the refreshed English and Maths curriculum documents. To support this mahi, we will be holding two Ministry and Board approved teacher only days. The first one will be on **Tuesday 3rd June**, the day after King's Birthday holiday, and the other on **Tuesday 28th October**, the day after Labour day. School will be closed for instruction on both of these dates.

I am sure you will have noticed the positive changes to the gardens as you walk through the school grounds. The planter boxes have been painted, the wooden walkways water blasted and the paving slabs have been lifted in preparation for being them to be relaid once the ground has been levelled. Pete and his team were at school again last weekend with their machines leveling the uneven ground in preparation for redefining the pebble paths and planting some grass seed. The gardens are starting to take shape and teachers have already noticed that the students are using this area of the school much more since the work has begun. I am excited to see the finished results and to watch our tamariki making more use of the sensory learning garden.

Please note, there is a change of time for tomorrow's (Friday 21st March) school assembly. It will be at the earlier time of **8.45am** in the hall. Tea and coffee are available so come along and help yourself to a cuppa. I hope to see you there.
