Tēnā koutou Whānau,

Learning at Waitoki for 2025 has begun with a hiss and a roar. The inquiry focus for this term is that the Earth is one planet in the solar system, which includes the Sun, planets, moons, and other celestial bodies. Mr Ashley, our resident scientist, led a rocket launch experiment as a provocation to get our tamariki thinking. Students in Y4 - Y8 are looking forward to going to the Stardome on **Tuesday 25th February** to learn more about our solar system. Whilst the senior students are learning about all the planets, the Y0 - Y3 students are focussing on planet earth and its environment. They have an EOTC visit to Kelly Tarltons planned for **Wednesday 26th March**, which has been organised to coincide with their learning about sea week.

The students are all busy preparing for school swimming sports from **11am** on **Friday 28th February**. You are most welcome to come along and cheer the children on. Melissa Smith and the fundraising team will be running a pop up cafe on that day and we will also have our usual Friday ice blocks for sale.

Melissa and her team are busy planning a few fundraising events for 2025, starting off with a **Colour Run** on **Friday 21st March from 1pm**. Assembly will be at 8.45am on that Friday, just for that week only. Melissa is also organising an **Easter Parade** for the end of Term 1, which is being sponsored by Harcourts.

One of the many advantages of intermediate school at Waitoki, is the way in which we are able to offer students' leadership opportunities. This year our eight herd leaders will be attending the GRIP leadership conference on **Wednesday 19th March**, aimed at developing their leadership skills. We have ordered our first EPRO8 kit and the Y7 & Y8 students will soon begin practising their STEM skills (science, technology, engineering and maths), collaboration and leadership in preparation for the Auckland wide EPRO8 competition during Term 4.

Reminder: Three way conferences between student, teacher and parents to collaboratively set learning goals for the first half of 2025 are being held on Tuesday 4th March. School will close at 12pm and 15 minute interviews will take place between 12.30pm - 7.30pm. Bookings can be made through the Skool Loop app.

Once again, Pete and his team of elves have been busy carrying out the essential garden maintenance work for us at no cost to the school. Melissa and I met with Pete last week and he has very kindly offered to continue to support our school. These are just some of the things that Pete plans on doing for us over the coming months; transplanting of lemon trees, make a planter box, relaying paving slabs, repairing and redirecting pebble path and edging, recontouring of all areas to prepare for topsoiling and grass seeding, transplanting of three playground grasses, filling dead spaces with the river rocks, supplying new weed matting for the potting shed walls, supply or transplant a citrus tree for the small garden area by Rūma Ono, and apply slow release fertiliser to all areas. As you can see, it is quite a list so I really appreciate Pete's ongoing support. I know that the gardens do look a wee bit messy at this stage, but please bear with us because it is going to be fabulous in the end. If you need any landscaping work done, please contact Pete Reelick Landscaping (027 436 3591).

We will need some community support with this project over the coming weeks with jobs such as; water blasting and then paint the balance beams, boardwalk and garden beds, lift and stack paving slabs ready for relaying, preparing the potting shed to be rewrapped in windbreak, prepare the veggie and herb gardens, putting mulch in the gardens at the front of the school and collecting up the rocks ready for redistribution. Melissa Neville has kindly

volunteered to coordinate help for these important jobs. We will also be holding a working bee this term so please watch this space if you are keen to get involved as many hands make light work.

Good luck to **Piper Stubbs**, who is representing Waitoki School in the Junior Farmer competition and to all the Waitoki students who are competing with their AG day lambs at the Helensville A & P show on **Saturday 22nd February.** If you are interested in going along, children 16 years and under are free, adults are \$15 each. The Junior Farmer competition starts at 9.30am. Please give our students a cheer and look out for the Waitoki School cows, which have been decorated by all the students in each class.

I hope to see you all at the **family picnic** tonight, **Friday 21st February from 5pm - 7pm.** This is an informal opportunity to chat to the teachers about how the first couple of weeks of term are going and to catch up with other families. **'Pasta e Basta'** food truck and **Mr Whippy** ice cream truck to be on site along with a sausage sizzle organised by the Waitoki School Board. You are also most welcome to bring your own picnic.

Reminder: Cellphones and Other Personal Digital Devices

Our approach to cellphones and other personal digital devices supports student engagement and achievement. The consent forms for the immunisation programme have been distributed to our year 7/8 students and will need to be returned by Monday 24 February. You must return the completed consent form even if you do not wish your child to be immunised.

Ice Block Fridays


Every Friday lunchtime, during Term 1, the Senior School will be selling ice blocks to fundraise for much needed resources in the Senior School. There will be two options:
