I hope you have all enjoyed the school holidays and made the most of over the coming term to help to support your child's learning the beautiful weather New Zealand had during the first week of the holidays. It was great to see everyone return to school on Monday morning with smiles on their faces.

It is going to be another busy term with lots of engaging activities planned for our learners starting with school cross country (if the weather plays ball) on **Tuesday 6th August**. This will be followed by the Kaipara cluster inter School competition on **Monday 12th August**. The students will be training for their running events over the next couple of weeks.

As I am sure you are aware, the Olympics began this week in Paris on Friday so next week, on **Tuesday 30th July**, Waitoki will be holding its own School Olympics. The children will compete in four rotated activities in their herds and each herd will be representing a different country. The Waitoki country style Olympic events include equestrian hobby horsing, gumboot throwing, javelin and three legged races. We think it is going to be a really fun day for our tamariki.

This term, alongside reading, writing and mathematics, a major learning focus will be related to the performing arts as we prepare for our Olympic themed school production "Going for Gold." Auditions were held at the end of term 2, the main parts have been cast and rehearsals are now underway. All of our students will be involved with the production in some way, whether it is acting, singing, dancing or supporting backstage. The production performances will be over three days, Tuesday 24th - Thursday 26th September and information about ticket sales will be shared with you in due course.

Whilst Ag Day and Country Fair are not due to be held at the beginning of Term 4, preparations have already begun. Serena Bateman, Becky Minton and Melissa Neville have been busy working behind the scenes to organise a number of fun Ag Day challenges to be completed during Term 3 so that every child can be actively involved in some way even if they are not able to raise an animal. Information about all the Ag Day challenges will be shared with students and families shortly. Alongside the work Becky, Serena and Melissa have been doing, Chantelle Taylor and Sara Thompson have once again been busy organising our Country Fair, to be held after Ag Day on Saturday 19th October. This was a really successful day last year and we hope you will all be involved with this wonderful community event. In the meantime I am very excited for the first lambs for lamb day care to arrive!

Many thanks to all the parents who took the opportunity to come along to our three way conferences and be part of your child's learning journey with us.
