Tēnā koutou Whanau,

The teachers have all been busy conducting assessments for reading, writing and maths to support them with writing mid year reports. The aim of the written report is to share student progress and achievement with whānau. Student reports will be sent home on Friday 5th July and there will be an opportunity for you to discuss the contents of it with your child and their teacher during three way conferences. These are being held on Tuesday 23rd July from 12.30pm - 7.30pm and it is important that your child attends so that they can talk about their learning with you and their teacher. School will close at 12pm on that day. Further information and instructions for booking appointments online will be shared with you shortly.

On Wednesday 26th June Waitoki School will be celebrating Matariki. Whānau are invited to join us around the bonfire for a hot chocolate at 7.40am. Our kapa haka groups will be performing at 8am. During the morning our tamariki will be in their herds for rotated activities followed by home-made soup at lunch time. In the afternoon they will come together for the school haka and to sing waiata. Students need bring a vegetable on either Monday or Tuesday for the soup. On the day, they need to wear their herd colours and bring a mug for hot chocolate, a mug for soup at lunchtime and a bread roll to go with their soup. We hope you will come along and join us for this school community event.

Our Y7 & Y8 team are doing well with their fundraising efforts for AIMs games in September. They have just received a very generous \$4,000 donation from Cam and Matt at **Procut Earthworks Limited**, which is really appreciated. There are three more Monday Sausage Sizzles to go before the end of term. Thank you to Dominique and Des Paul from **JAD Contracting** for continuing to provide the bread and sausages for this each week.

One of the things we are continuing to focus on is student **attendance**. All students are legally required to

attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility between parents and the school to make sure our learners attend and engage in learning from when they first start school. If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss more than a whole year of school by 16 years of age. You, as parents or caregivers, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance.

The government's new attendance target is for 80 percent of students to be present for more than 90 percent of the term. Average student attendance at Waitoki School during Term 1 2024 was 88% and so far during Term 2 the average rate of attendance is 83.5%. Please let us know if your child is going to be absent or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical appointment. Family holidays or taking time off for birthdays or extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not considered acceptable reasons for being absent by the Ministry.
