Port Chalmers Pāua lost 4-1 against Fairfield Hawks. Player of the day went to William.


Port Chalmers Mangō lost 2-1 against Tahuna Fireballs. Player of the day went to Rex.

#### **COUGHS AND COLDS**

Coughs and colds are common for children and adults throughout the year, but particularly during the winter months. Children starting at preschool or school for the first time will be exposed to new bugs or germs and may develop frequent illness or colds for the first year. These are often also passed onto other family members.

As these minor illnesses can make preschool or school activities difficult for children, they should:

- Be kept at home
- Given rest and quiet activities
- Have plenty of drinks and fluids
- Given Paracetamol, as per instructions, to relieve aches and pains
- Seen by a doctor if their symptoms do not improve or they get worse
