Port Chalmers School is quite unique in that we offer a Boating programme for our Senior pupils, from years 5-8. Pupils have opportunities to learn how to operate Kayaks, Canoes, Dinghies, Paddleboards and Optimist Yachts and our Outdoor Education Committee members assist with tuition, undertake the maintenance of our equipment and also operate our safety boats out on the water.

We also rely on parent helpers to assist with running our programme on the foreshore. As a parent volunteer you need no special skills or boating experience. Having extra pairs of hands and eyes available during boating sessions is essential in order for our programme to run smoothly. Many of you have indicated that you are available for boating sessions already. Thank you for that! I look forward to working with you during the term.

We have four scheduled sessions for term one and our first session will take place on Monday 19th February, weather dependent. The rest of the dates for term one are on the calendar below.

When scheduling session dates, I always check on the tide calendar. An ideal session will take place on an incoming high tide or an outgoing high tide. Although I can control the scheduling with the tides, I cannot control the weather! If it is too cold or raining heavily or too windy (particularly SE winds), I will cancel the session. I want the pupils to have enjoyable and safe experiences on the water and unfavourable conditions can cause fear and anxiety. Many of our pupils have not had a great deal of boating experiences due to disruptions and inclement weather, therefore having close to ideal conditions is necessary in order that they build confidence and competence when boating.

I would appreciate hearing from anyone out there in our school community who has knowledge of boating and sailing, operating motorboats and maintaining watercraft, who may like to join our committee. Over the last few years, a number of our long serving members have had to retire and we are on the lookout for new members who may be interested in joining us. If you, (or someone you know), is interested in this opportunity, please come and have a chat with me here at school.

In the meantime, here's to a grand term of Boating for our pupils!
