Artist-in-Residence Programme

We are thrilled to share the excitement of our annual Artist-in-Residence programme, which is starting next week. This long-standing tradition reflects our school's deep commitment to the arts.

Through this programme, students have the extraordinary opportunity to learn directly from talented artists, exploring new techniques, perspectives, and ideas. It's a chance to ignite their imaginations, build confidence, and see the world through fresh eyes.



This year the students will be working with the talented Beau Cotton.

A local, Beau is a maker who graduated from Wintec Hamilton in 2012 with a BA in Media arts.

Beau's practice butterflies between

sculpture, fashion and installation. He works with found object(s) as materials, reworking them into new narratives and possibilities. Rarely being satisfied with the imposed or standard, Beau's intention is to research and classify the found and composing them into a state of new desire.

An example of one of Beau's pieces - a wire rope necklace, made from weathered wire rope segments, ceramic beads, wooden abacus beads on a nylon waxed



cord. All the pieces in this necklace have been found.

Beau has been in to introduce himself to the students. He has gifted each student with a pouch made from denim jeans rescued from going to landfill.

Using the pouch, he has set the students the task of finding their own treasures/found materials that they could use to turn into a piece of jewellery next week.

Artist in Residence Programme


