## Pepeha


Karaka have been working on their pepeha this term, including a 'visual pepeha'. A pepeha is a formal Maaori introduction that articulates an individual's connections to their ancestral lands, waterways, significant landmarks, and whaanau (family). For our families within this rural New Zealand school context, understanding and sharing their pepeha serves as a powerful means of establishing identity, belonging, and whakapapa (genealogy). It fosters a deeper appreciation for their heritage and its intrinsic link to the local environment, strengthening the collective identity of our school community and enriching our understanding of the diverse backgrounds that contribute to its unique character.
